

Early Years Services Map* – QUICK TIPSHEET

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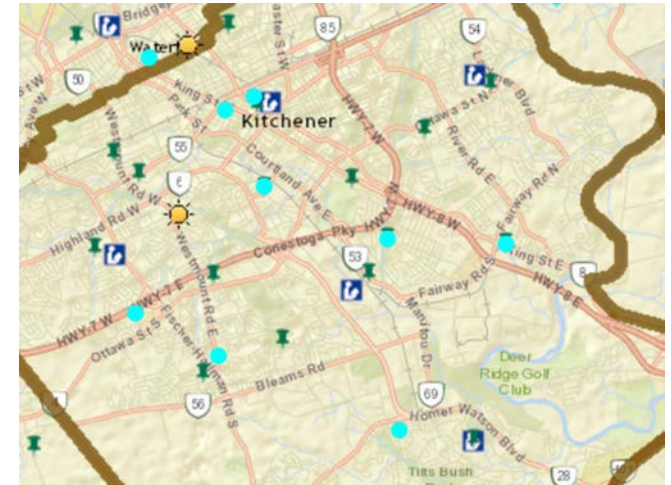
1. View Programs and Services by Mapped Location

This function allows you to see the services in any given neighbourhood or geographic location. You will be provided a copy of the map, plus a listing of the services and their address. You can also print your map.

To view the map, Click: **I Want To/Search Program by Category/Select Program Category**

Use the +/- feature to zoom in or out.

To Print your map, Click: **I Want To/Create a Printable Map/Create File**

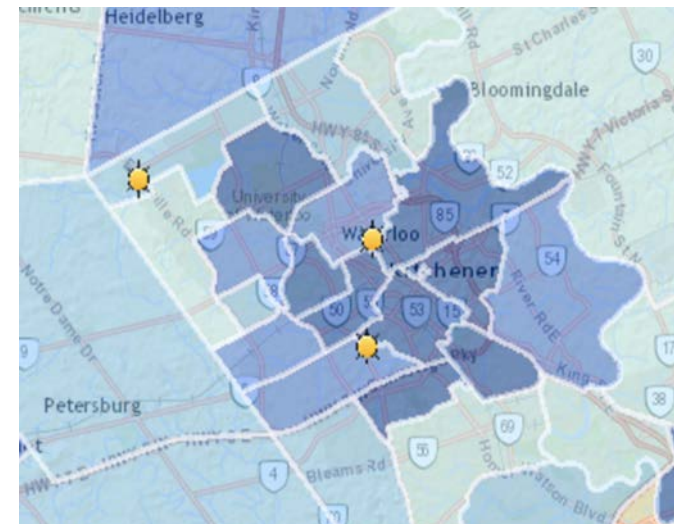


2. Map Services and Child Indicator Results

This function allows you to map the results of the 4 Child Wellbeing Indicator (Fundamental needs, Relationships, Health, or Learning) and overlap this information with existing services.

To create your own report, Click: **I Want To/Turn Map Data On/Off/Map Theme** (choose one of the 4 indicators from the drop down menu)/**Operational Layers** (choose one of the service types listed - if your service is not listed in that menu, click: **I want To/Search Program by Category**)

To Print your map, Click: **I Want To/Create a Printable Map/Create File**

3. Create Report by Location on Child Wellbeing Indicators

This function allows you to create a report, *by neighbourhood*, outlining the results of the 4 Child Wellbeing Indicators (Fundamental needs, Relationships, Health, Learning). You can also print a report for your reference.


To create your own report, Click: **I Want To/Create a Report/Select Report Area** (you can use the tools to identify one specific point/neighbourhood or a larger area with multiple neighbourhoods)/**Download Report**

To Print your downloaded report, Click: **Print** (from your computer's option menu)

DISPOSABLE INCOME: Highest % families without disposable income
The Disposable Income Measure (DIM) asks whether or not families have money left over at the end of the month to save, buy extras, or use in an emergency, after they have paid for necessities. Families that do not have money left over are less likely to be able to withstand an additional financial pressure without sacrificing basic needs. Data for the DIM comes from the Kindergarten Parent Survey (2010). See Footnote 1.

HEALTHY BABIES HEALTHY CHILDREN: Higher % of families identified with potential risk
The Healthy Babies Healthy Children (HBHC) Screen was developed by the Ministry of Children and Youth Services (MCYS). It is a comprehensive tool for identifying families with potential risk of negative developmental outcomes for children who may benefit from HBHC services. It is a standardized.
